## 10TH JANUARY, 2016

Parish Pastoral Council suggested meeting 26th January at 7.00 pm

We had some difficulties with some children making a mess of the church during the week. They clearly had been using votive candles as weapons and throwing them at each other inside and outside the church. They played with the altar candles and have left some wax puddles in the carpets. They also set fire to at least one of the bows on the seats and damaged three more. It would be helpful if people would keep an eye on the church any time they are passing. The police have been very good with us and are dropping in and out when they are passing—if you see any police in the church it would be good if you would thank them for dropping in.

This gave rise to the question of whether it is time to look at some CCTV in the church. As luck would have it, a telephone call to the PP seemed to have a possible solution and benefit at the same time.

The firm which broadcasts the Cathedral live on the internet phoned to see if we were interested in the same thing...clearly there are advantages in broadcasting our church on the internet all day from a security point of view, but also it would mean that anyone could watch daily and Sunday Mass from their homes—a big advantage to the housebound.

The PP intends to meet with the firm and have a look at this as a possibility—but what do you think about this idea, it would be good to have some feedback.

On the subject of the internet, the PP has not been wasting his time over the festive season.. the parish website has been updated (a process not yet finished) and located to a simpler URL namely [www.stpaulwhiteinch.org](http://www.stpaulwhiteinch.org)—do have a look and see what you think.
